

TAMIL LITERARY WEEK



ENGLISH LITERARY WEEK





Whether through vibrant costumes or complex identity-based poetry, our learners demonstrated that literacy is not just about reading it's about finding one's voice.


Our learners kicked off the week with a burst of color, arriving as their favorite book heroes and creating detailed character posters. Their enthusiasm during class presentations showed a wonderful growth in confidence and public speaking. They focused on the art of the “visual narrative,” mastering the balance of dialogue and illustration in their original comic strips, My Story in Pictures. They took a reflective turn, composing “A Moment in Time” poems based on personal memories, and sharpened their collaborative skills through an energetic Story Board Game.



They had dived deep into their class readers, creating “Mini Books” that analyzed plot and character, while also exploring nature through their “Curious Bear” poems.
