The event kicked off with introductions for the teachers and alumni on stage. As the discussion shifted toward major university topics, the alumni shared some truly exceptional insights that left me genuinely ineffable. As the session progressed, the more enlightened I felt.

It was an incredibly valuable experience. It gave me a much clearer, more realistic picture of what it takes to be the kind of candidate top-tier universities are looking for. What stood out most was how eager the alumni were to share real, unfiltered advice from their own lives. At times, they even jumped in mid-conversation just to drop a crucial piece of guidance at the exact right moment. Hearing their personal experiences, practical study hacks, workload strategies, and general dos and don'ts hit me with a sudden reality check now is the time to step up. I need to make the absolute most of where I am right now to earn a spot at one of the few universities that top my priority chart and achieve my dreams.

Beyond the advice, seeing what they had accomplished was genuinely motivating. They proved that while getting where you want to be isn't easy, it is entirely possible with focus and dedication isn't some stroke of pure luck or an unachievable phenomenon, but the direct result of effort. I felt lucky to walk away with so many different perspectives to pull from, giving me a much better idea of which path makes the most sense for me.

It was an extraordinary session. The piece of advice that stuck with me the most was simple:

"Remember, you don't find the university... the university finds you."

In short, there's no need to stress over hunting down a "perfect" university—focus on your own growth, and the right fit will naturally follow.

Ultimately, attending this talk shifted my perspective from merely preparing for exams to actively building my own character and academic identity. Moving forward, I am determined to approach my studies with greater intent, engage meaningfully in my areas of interest, and trust that my consistent dedication will pave the way toward my future ambitions.
